

## HASKELL CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

June 14, 2021

The regular meeting of the Haskell City Council was held at 7:00 p.m. at the Haskell City Hall on Monday June 14, 2021.

Mayor Roy Carman called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Mayor Roy Carman led the Pledge of Allegiance; prayer was given by Jeff Harrison

Brad Cotten made the motion to accept the May 10, 2021 meeting minutes. Jeff Harrison seconded motion. Motion passed unanimously by yea vote.

### DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS:

#### 1. WATER/SEWER

- The report was given by Public Works Director Casey Caudle, a copy of which is filed with these minutes.
- The pipe is being delivered for the sewer plant betterment project, which is set to start construction soon.
- The pump at N Harding has quit. A new pump was purchased and a back up pump is to be either rebuilt or purchased.

#### 2. STREETS

- The report was given by PW Director Casey Caudle.
- *Jacob Warner asked about the situation regarding the culverts that were replaced on Quantz. PWD Casey Caudle will evaluate the situation.*

##### **1. Monthly Income and Expense Statements.**

##### **2. Resolution 08-2021, a Resolution to apply for Parks grant monies for the year of 2022.**

##### **3. Police Vehicle Discussion**

- Due to rising costs of maintenance on police vehicles, an option of leasing/purchasing new vehicles has been explored and presented to the Council.
- After a substantial discussion with the possibility of looking into State bid programs and Piggy back programs, Brad Cotten made a motion to table this discussion until next month when more information can be provided. Warren Kuhn seconded motion. Motion passed unanimously by yea vote.

##### **4. Resolution 09-2021, a Resolution amending the Police Policy and Procedures manual to add a social networking section.**

- After a brief discussion, Brad Cotten made a motion to pass/approve Resolution 09-2021. Rodney Lyman seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken. Motion passed unanimously by yea vote.

- Mike Krebs addressed the issue of no public parking next to the Police Department. Mr. Krebs was informed that we would look into how we can better accommodate our public.
